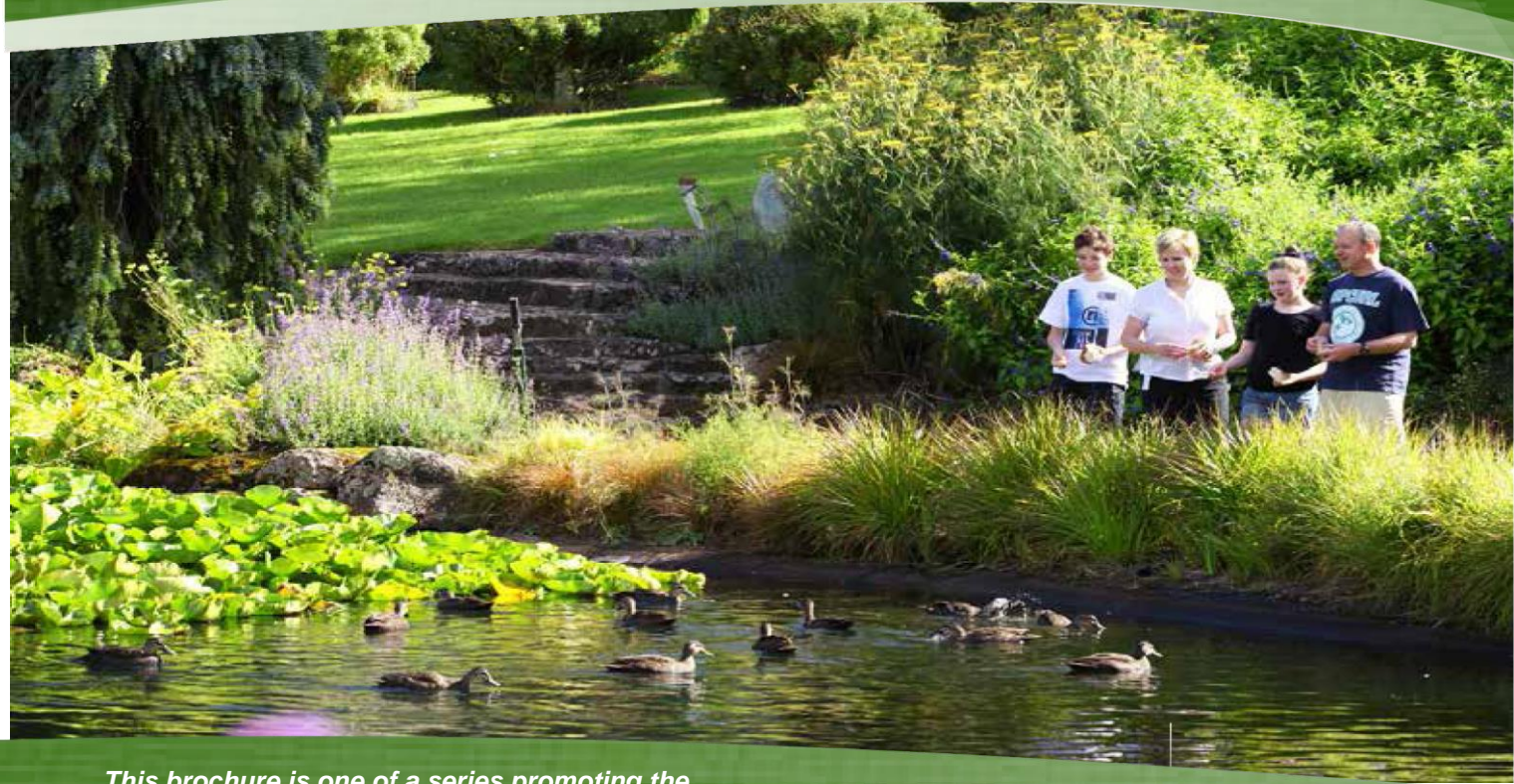

Bringalbit was first settled in 1858 and is a unique part of Australia's rural history. The setting, in the Sidonia Hills, fifteen minutes from Kyneton, is stunning. The huge old trees, 1890's ornamental lake and gardens provide a rare mood of peace and tranquillity. Peacocks, ducks, chickens, guinea fowl, wild birds, Suffock sheep and Highland cattle are a feature of the farm. The garden rambles through ten acres of parkland with stone walls and steps, box parterres and new plantings revealing many surprises.

Open weekends 10am-4pm or by appointment.

The garden of Ard Choille (pronounced Arda hillier), both botanically and historically, is one of the best renowned Mt. Macedon gardens. These gardens, as a group, represent one of the most important and significant collections of nineteenth century gardens in Australia. This, one of the largest and most beautiful gardens in Victoria, is practically unknown. It is a hidden garden tucked away in a fold of the hills so that you can neither see it from above or below.
