Deborah and Rob's garden on the verge immediately in front of the house was designed as a showcase for edible and medicinal plantings, while maintaining an attractive aesthetic. The conditions are quite harsh and not all plants have survived; they do a lot of mulching for summer but still need to water as well.

The plants include a row of clipped bay trees, fruit – dwarf quinces and peach, cherries, goji berry, Chilean guava, pomegranate and vegetables such as artichoke, potatoes and a variety of herbs.
