#### Gisborne

Jacksons Creek walk: access from Station Road or Robertson Street


**4 km** Circuit track – An extensive walking trail along the southern bank of Jackson Creek encompassing the Gisborne Botanic Gardens, which feature a New Zealand garden.

#### Riddells Creek

Conglomerate Gully Nature Reserve: 123 Wheelwrights Road

2.84 km - A hill loop walk.

The walk takes you through a forest with native grassland understory along an ephemeral stream. In spring, it is one of the best places in the Macedon Ranges to see native orchids.

#### Mt Macedon

**Macedon Regional Park** covers much of the surrounding mountain range, is part of the Great Dividing Range, and incudes Mount Macedon.

The park boasts diverse flora and fauna, with more than 400 species of native plants and 299 species of birds recorded.

There are great opportunities to explore the park on foot via a series of walks that make up the Macedon Ranges Walking Track (loop).

- Camels Hump
- Memorial Cross
- Lake Sanatorium
- Clyde Track & Alton Track
- Zig Zag Track
- Mount Towrona Track

#### Woodend

**Five Mile Creek Track:** Start from the Woodend Visitor Information Centre

**3.4km** – A pleasant stroll or a vigorous walk, the Five Mile Creek Track offers an interesting course though areas of unique vegetation, with adjoining picnic grounds, reserves, and recreational facilities.

### Hanging Rock Reserve

**Rock Summit Walk:** 139 South Rock Road, Woodend

1.6km - Explore the famous Hanging Rock on this short but invigorating walk to the summit and reward yourself with great views in every direction.

**Hanging Rock Explorer:** 139 South Rock Road, Woodend **3.3km –** This walk explores the reserve around Hanging Rock, including the small racecourse lake, the forest around the Rock itself and the beautiful parkland areas.

Note: An entry fee applies to visit Hanging Rock reserve

## Kyneton

Campaspe River Walk: 15 Mollison Street

**3.5 km** – This easy riverside walk commences upstream from Kyneton Botanic Gardens (established 1858) and finishes at the Kyneton Race course. Alternatively, there are various access points along the walk.

Black Hill Reserve: Ennis Road

**4km** Circuit Track – Gentle inclines with no steps, good views of rock formations and nearby countryside. Walking clockwise is less strenuous than anti-clockwise.

- **2.7km** Ridge Track A much more strenuous walk with some steep inclines and well over 200 steps. Extensive views to Mount Alexander and surrounding country. Numerous large rock formations, cave rocks and lookouts.
- **1.7km** Revegetated area Track An easy walk with no inclines or steps providing the best opportunity to see kangaroos and other native animals abundant in this reserve.
